#### PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The intent of my messages to the WIN is to summarise Parish Council meetings for those who are interested but are unable to attend the meetings.

The Parish Council held a meeting on the  $5^{th}$  September and a range of items were discussed.

Before going into them, I would like to extend my thanks to Fred Carter on behalf of the village. Fred has represented the village on the Patient Participation Group run by the Downland Practice for around 14 years. Thank you Fred. Joe Clerkin has kindly offered to take up the reins and I have already seen messages from Joe seeking feedback from the village.

The Village Hall Management Committee have had many of the village hall windows replaced. This will help with the running costs over the winter months and looks much better aesthetically, a separate project will be initiated to replace the front windows. As a reminder, funding for the completed project came from external grants as well as contributions from the village.

The recurring topic of a Neighborhood Plan was also discussed and whilst it is clear there is limited appetite within the village to create a plan at this time, the Parish Council cannot contribute to a neighborhood plan so either volunteers are required or funding would be required to get external help. The District Council strategy is not clear at this point so I anticipate this is a topic for discussion in the future.

Households who have garden vegetation and obstructions encroaching on the Main Steet pavements were also brought up during the meeting. There are areas along Main Street which are difficult to use for mobility scooter users and families with prams. It would be appreciated if everyone could ensure pavements are kept clear for all passersby.

The weed growth along pavements has been reported to West Berkshire Council. It is clear the weeds will damage the pavements if not treated.

Organization of the annual fireworks was also discussed and the Village Hall Management Committee will be coordinating the event along with volunteers. I am sure more details will be publicised nearer the time.

#### UPDATE FROM CLLR CAROLYNE CULVER

Dear Residents

Since May I have been chairman of Scrutiny Commission. On 14 September we looked at the council's revenue and capital budget performance. The council is currently trying to save around £6million. We also had a presentation from DCI Evans from Thames Valley Police. The next meeting will be 6.30pm on Wednesday 11 October to review the activities of Thames Water and the Environment Agency. I have received lots of questions from concerned residents, flood forums and organisations that campaign to protect our rivers from sewage. The meeting will be streamed live on <u>the Council's</u> <u>YouTube channel</u> for residents wanting to follow the meeting as it happens or at their convenience later. Scrutiny is crucial to the democratic process, allowing residents and opposition and backbench councillors to explore the detail of Council decisions and challenge anything of concern. In an 'executive-led' Council like West Berkshire where power is centralised, the role of the Scrutiny Commission is essential. We have a very lengthy work programme of subjects we want to look at in more detail including foster care provision, why West Berkshire has a poor record of educational achievement for children who have free school meals, and why we have a poor record of helping disabled people find employment. Scrutiny will be holding a series of meetings starting in October to learn lessons from the covid pandemic.

The deadline for Members' Community Bids, whereby WBC match funds parish council and community projects, is 31<sup>st</sup> October. I have been in touch with the parish council about this. If you would like to know more please contact me.
