**NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH Fred Carter**



**As Christmas is approaching,** please be careful with leaving shopping in your vehicle – you never know who is watching! If you are going away for Christmas ask someone to keep an eye on your house and inform your neighbours. It

is a good idea to give a neighbour a contact number where to reach you in an emergency.

**Ecards** (or electronic greetings cards) have become very popular over the last few years....If you send ecards, have you considered whether or not the ecard you are sending is safe, or whether it is OK to open an ecard you have received, even if it is from someone you know.

Most people do not consider the dangers from ecards and unfortunately, there are plenty. Having said that, most cards you receive from friends are safe and easy to use. However since there are quite a few ecard scams going around right now, Scambusters want to help you make sure you do not become a scam victim.

What are the biggest ecard dangers? A legitimate-looking ecard, once it is clicked and /or downloaded, might actually be spyware, spam or a computer virus. For example your computer might start displaying obscene images, barrage you with pop-up ads, launch adult web sites or start sending bogus ecards to those in your address book that appear to come from you.

Here is an example of an ecard scam that is trickier than the most phishing scams: The ecard looks like it comes from Hallmark and asks you to download an attachment to pick up your ecard. However the attachment is in fact a Trojan.

Telltale signs of a fake ecard. Here are a few clues than an ecard is bogus...

- Selling mistakes e.g. your name is misspelled
- Error in the message e.g. it says you sent a card rather than received one
- The sender isn't someone you know, Why should someone you don't know send you a card
- The sender has a bogus name Joe cool, Card sender, Secret Admirer etc
- Or the URL appears odd e.g. [www.http://](http://www) rather than <http://www>

How to avoid trouble from fake ecards

- If in any doubt don't open it.
- Delete any card from somebody you don't know
- Never click on anything from an unknown source
- Never open an attachment from an unknown source
- Never download from an unknown source
- Never click to accept Terms from any company without reading the fine print.

Scambuster recommend against opening any ecard with an attachment, You never know what is really in the attachment until it is too late

## CRIME REPORT

*Our thanks to PC Andrew Buckingham (Hungerford Police 08458 505 505) who emails us with his NWN article, from which we extract items which may be valuable in keeping villagers alert to what's going on in the area:*



We're pleased to report that PC Buckingham's NWN reports haven't included anything local to West Ilsley over the last few weeks, so here's some "good" news:

### Crime Report 10/11

It is always good to report on good police work and thanks to the efforts of the Newbury CID a number of burglaries which impacted heavily on the rural villages in West Berkshire between 2004 and 2005 have been detected. On Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October, David Carlile aged 32 from the Bristol area and of no fixed abode was jailed for seven years when he appeared before Swindon Crown Court. He was charged with a number of burglaries in Wiltshire, which he admitted and asked for some 100 further similar offences committed across Wiltshire, Gloucestershire and Thames Valley, to be taken into consideration. These included 26 offences in West Berkshire where goods worth £280,000 were stolen. He was linked to the series in West Berkshire by a fingerprint left at one scene and blood at another.

It has been some while since we put a piece in West Ilsley News. While not that much has changed, there may be new people in the village who may not know we exist and there may be a few people who need a reminder that were here!

The Downland Sports Centre is a small Centre that is shared between the Downs School in Compton and the local community and is open from 6 – 10.00pm Monday to Friday.

We have a large Sports Hall marked for several sports – 5-a-side Football, Basketball, Netball, Volleyball etc. We have recently purchased Volleyball posts and it would be exciting to see an interest shown in Volleyball. The hall is also used for Circuit Training and Trampoline courses. Our children's parties are very popular and are held in the sports hall. You can choose from a range of parties to suit your child and age.

In addition to the Sports Hall, we have a small Gym, Tennis Courts and an outdoor swimming pool (very popular in the summer).

For the young people in the community we offer a Junior Gym session. This is held on a Thursday (4.30 - 5.30 pm) for young people aged 11 – 16 and is supervised by a qualified instructor. The sessions must be pre-booked and paid for in advance. The sessions are designed to encourage activity, the correct use of the gym ..... and to be fun!

We are proud of the reputation we have for our Children's Holiday Activity Programme. The activities are for children aged between 5 – 11 years and take place every holiday period from 10.00 am – 2.30 pm (Mon – Fri). The children have seriously good fun, can suggest activities they would like to do and while here make lots of friends. Some of the children started attending when they were very young and are now volunteer helpers!

One recent change is that there is now a new large car park which is the last entrance (if travelling from Compton to Hampstead Norreys) on the left hand side past the school.



## Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2005

### Correspondence

Letter received back (5<sup>th</sup> October) from Melvyn May, Highways manager in response to our letter. In summary: The silt deposits (Catmore Road), blocked drainage grips, channels and ditch silting will be added to the annual grip cutting and sweeping programmes and addressed within the next 28 days.

The Council reiterated that the Ditch between the Cricket Pitch and the road is the Landlord's responsibility. The extensive drainage work done in 2000/2001 was initiated following excessive rainfall and flooding and was financed in the form of a one-off payment. This means the Council is unable to sustain this level of service under its normal budget. The Clerk to inform the Cricket Club.

Regarding the pond side railings, the Council had little success in identifying the owner. They are not of standard highway design.

Letter received back re Traffic Management (6<sup>th</sup> October). The location of the 30mph speed signs was examined and a report is due.

A speed survey was conducted and it appears that 85% of cars at 100m outside the village speed signs are travelling at 54mph for eastbound and 58mph for west bound vehicles to the west of the village and 45mph and 48mph respectively to the east of the village.

The Clerk to respond with comments – re speeding.

The local MP was asked to be our guest speaker for next May's Parish Assembly. Unfortunately he is always in Parliament on Mondays. He has suggested a Friday. The Council to consider other speakers or the Friday alternative date.

### The Play Ground working group.

The group received 20 positive questionnaires and 1 negative plus plenty of useful feedback. The group will now start to cost out various levels of play equipment and start to consider its feasibility re funding/maintenance/position etc.

### New Charity Deed between West Ilsley and Lockinge Estate

The Solicitor has requested signatories so the new Charity can be registered. The Clerk to follow up the Memorandum of Understanding with The Village Hall and Cricket Club and circulate.
